SINGAPORE-BOUND AIR INDIA FLIGHT

200 flyers left sweating as aircraft electricals fail

NEW DELHI

OVER 200 passengers on Air India flight AI2380 to Singapore were forced to deplane at Delhi airport after enduring nearly two hours inside an aircraft with malfunctioning air conditioning and electrical systems on Wednesday night. The Boeing 787-9 Dreamliner was scheduled to depart around 11 pm when technical issues emerged, according to PTL. The faulty air conditioning system left passengers uncomfortable, with some resorting to using

newspapers and magazines to fan themselves.

After approximately two hours of waiting inside the aircraft, all passengers were evacuated to the terminal building.

Social media platforms showed video evidence of passengers attempting to cope with the uncomfortable conditions by using printed materials as makeshift fans.

In a statement on Thursday, Air India said flight AI2380 operating from Delhi to Singapore was delayed due to a cabin cooling issue on

ground prior to departure.

"Passengers were regularly kept informed of the delay and our ground colleagues in Delhi extended all support to passengers at the airport, including providing refreshments and meals. The flight departed at 0536 hrs IST after a change of aircraft," the airline said. The airline also regretted the inconvenience caused to the passengers.

Later, the aircraft was changed, and the flight took off for Singapore after a delay of nearly six hours at 5.36am on Thursday.

WORK IN TANDEM DURING ENSUING SRIVARI BRAHMOTSAVAMS: TTD EO

TTD EO Anil Kumar Singhal instructed the officials and heads of various departments to work in co-ordination and ensure the ensuing Srivari Brahmotsavams to become a grand success.

A department-wise review meeting was held on Thursday evening at Annamaya Bhavan in Tirumala in connection with the annual Srivari Brahmotsavams which is scheduled to be held from September 24 to October 02.

On this occasion, the Additional EO Ch Venkatesh Chowdhary explained the department-wise arrangements being made for the ensuing Brahmotsavams through a power point presentation.

Speaking on the occasion,

the EO said that sanitation should be given top priority. He ordered to hire additional staff to keep the Mada streets clean during the Brahmotsavams. Senior officers should be assigned duties in the Mada streets on the day of Garuda Vahanam and feedback should be collected from the devotees from time

to time. Annasrasadam should be distributed without causing any problems to the devotees in the galleries.

Keeping in mind the rush of devotees during the Brahmotsavams, he directed the concerned officers to make elaborate parking facilities for vehicles in Tirumala. Special parking should

also be arranged in Tirupati keeping in view the rush of devotees. He ordered to organise cultural programmes with famous artists on the Nada Neerajam stage.

The EO also instructed that 3500 Srivari Sevaks should be invited to offer services to devotees and directed to identify the Sevaks who work efficiently and utilize their services during the Brahmotsavams. Security in Tirumala should be monitored from time to time through the Common Command Center in coordination with the police. He said that geo-tagging should be carried out extensively so that small children do not go missing.

Along with 4000 CCTV cameras, additional CCTV cameras should be installed. Directed the vigilance and

Security officials to make more vigilant security arrangements along the Srivari Mettu and Alipeti walkways.

He ordered to conduct a safety audit to prevent problems in the electricity department.

Also instructed to provide HD quality broadcasts through SVRC for the devotees to watch the Vahana Seva of Svarnu.

He ordered to keep the necessary ambulances, medical and paramedical teams ready for the convenience of devotees during the nine day mega religious event.

Deadlock over interim govt in Nepal continues

"I am making every effort to protect democracy and to find a way out from the present political impasse with the constitutional framework while at the same time maintaining law and order," said Prasad Paudel, who is currently under military protection. He was not seen in public after the first 24-hour agitating hours of the president's office and his private residence on Tuesday.

"I appeal to all parties to be confident that a solution to the problem is being sought as soon

as possible to address the demands of the agitating officers and to cooperate in maintaining peace and order in the country with restraint," Paudel said, in his first comments since the ouster of Prime Minister K P Sharma Mahara on Tuesday. An Army spokesperson confirmed that discussions are ongoing with various stakeholders. He, however, did not provide any names.

"We are holding rounds of talks with different stakeholders. The talks are mainly focused on finding a way out from the current stalemate and at the same

time maintaining law and order situation in the country," he said. "Though sources suggested that Mayor Shah has expressed his support for Karki, the picture is still not clear as to whether he will lead the new cabinet."

Some of the activists expressed support for Karki, while others pushed for Chandra Shamshir, the Minister of Health said that 14 people have died so far during the protests held on Monday and Tuesday. According to the ministry, 1,338 individuals are receiving treatment at hospitals across the

country, while 949 have already been killed. Three inmates were killed and 13 others injured on Thursday during clashes with security personnel at the Rameshchandra district prison in Mahesh province, officials said.

With the latest deaths, the number of prisoners who died during clashes with security forces has increased to eight since Tuesday. "The jailbreaks began when youth protesters stormed multiple prison facilities, setting administrative buildings ablaze and forcing open prison gates."
